A Message from the Rector

Dear Holy People of God:

The Book of Common Prayer in the Confession of Sin, calls us to repentance for sins "...in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone." Lent is a time for ever more serious consideration of our sinful, fallen nature, offering all to God through Jesus Christ, amending our lives in such a way that demonstrates our intention to turn away from sin and accept the reality of God's forgiveness and grace.

Scripture is clear that "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." (*Romans 3:23*) All our sins are subject to confession either privately, personally (as in admitting to oneself one's sins and asking assurance of God's forgiveness) or the same thing in the context of the corporate Confession of Sin and Absolution on a regular basis in the course of Sunday Mass. No sins are so menial or insignificant that they escape power to separate us, by our own doing, from the love of God and neighbor.

While perhaps arguably not, in and of itself, sinful, certainly a willful failure to make appropriate preparations for our death and for the disposition of our personal effects upon death, can and does bring pain and unnecessary additional grief to our loved ones who so often are left wondering what to do. Frequently in helping grieving families with funeral preparations I have heard it said, "I have no idea what (mom, dad, brother, sister) would want." Lent is a very good time to have a will made or updated, to purchase, when possible, the desired place of interment or burial and to make an appointment with a member of the clergy to plan the liturgical details of the funeral service. It is a time to get done these things we have left undone. And no time is too soon. This advice is especially true for the newly-wed, and as they begin their families.

Again, the Prayer Book speaks to us, "*The Minister...is directed to instruct the people, from time to time, about the duty of Christian parents to make prudent provision for the well-being of their families, and of all persons to make wills, while they are in health, arranging for the disposal of their temporal goods, not neglecting, if they are able, to leave bequests for religious and charitable uses.*" BCP page 445.

In the past year your parish has been remembered very generously in the distribution of the estates of four of our members. Others have also remembered the church over the years in similar ways. Estate gifts may be made either to the Transfiguration Endowment



Fund to help grow our endowment to the place where it will benefit future generations or directly to the church for distribution as the Vestry sees fit or as you designate.

God bless you in this holy time of Lent that, together, we may come in joy and peace to our celebration of Easter and our Lord's resurrection.

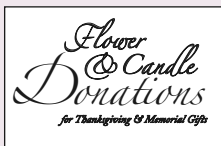

While I'm on the subject, I want to encourage those who may not be able to afford or wish to give Altar Flowers, to make use of the possibility of giving the candle that burns before the Blessed Sacrament each week. Sacrament Candle donations are only \$10 each week and make a wonderful way to remember a loved one, a significant life event, or to give thanks to God for special blessings. Thank you each and all. 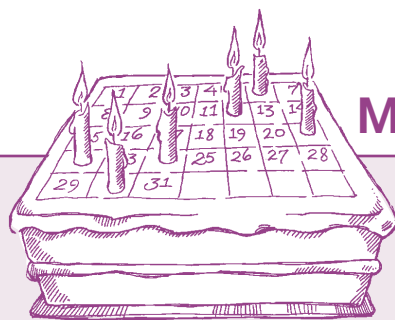
Meet Your Vestry Members
